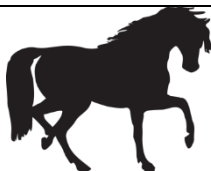

HORSE & PONY CLASSES

RULES FOR ALL HORSE AND PONY CLASSES INCLUDING SHOWJUMPING – PLEASE READ AND KEEP

- 1 Closing date for postal entries strictly **FRIDAY 21st July 2017**. Closing date for on-line entries 23 July 2017. **No entries will be accepted after this date. PLEASE NOTE NO ENTRIES ON THE DAY (with the exception of Show Jumping).**
- 2 The show is also affiliated to The Showing Register North East Regional Final 22ND and 23RD 2017 October at Countryside Live, Great Yorkshire Showground.
- 3 Entries of £8 (excluding medical fee) or more will entitle the competitor to one gate entry ticket; entries over £16 (excluding medical fee) will entitle the competitor to a maximum of two gate entry tickets. Gate entry tickets will not be posted for entries received after the closing date. Anyone without a gate entry ticket will be charged for entry to the showground; advance gate entry tickets can be purchased at a discount. Please see entry form.
- 4 Please ensure you have read the General Society Rules. Further information is available on the website – www.weetonshow.co.uk
- 5 No entries accepted unless accompanied by correct entry fees and large letter first class stamped addressed A5 or larger envelope for returning numbers. If you have not received numbers by 27th July please email Horse Secretary.
- 6 Competitor numbers and hard hats/skull caps, that conform to current BSI standards or above, must be worn at all times when mounted on the showground. No one falling off in the ring will be allowed to remount.
- 7 There is a compulsory payment of £2.00 for each competitor to cover the provision of medical services.
- 8 The organisers accept no liability whatsoever for any accident, damage, injury, illness to horses/owners/riders or any other person or property. All entrants do so at their own risk and as a condition of entry competitors must declare that they hold a minimum third party liability insurance.
- 9 No lunging allowed anywhere on show ground, warm up in horse designated areas only, remember many of the spectators are not used to horses.
- 10 Objections must be made in writing to the General Secretary with a deposit of £10. See Society Rule 14.
- 11 All cups and trophies are to be returned to the Trophy Secretary 5 weeks before the show. See Society Rule 19.
- 12 The Society will not be responsible for incorrect classification of exhibits. Please declare eligibility for specific special prizes on entry form.
- 13 Judging will start in each Ring promptly on completion of previous class. Competitors are advised to be on the field early, as it is impossible to say how long each class will take. Class timings are estimates only and subject to change.
- 14 Competitors are reminded that they should carry horse passports at all times.
- 15 **All postal horse and pony entries, including show jumping, to be sent to: Horse Secretary, Shelley L Williams, The Old Granary, Crain Syke Farm, North Rington, Leeds, LS17 0AD.**

AFFILIATIONS

This Show is affiliated to Equifest, taking place at the East of England Showground 9TH to 13th August 2017 and The Showing Register, North East Regional final 22nd and 23rd October at Countryside Live, Great Yorkshire Showground.

The two highest placed equines not already qualified in each affiliated class will qualify.

All in-hand classes are affiliated to TSR.

Driving classes are a qualifier for the 2017 Osborne Refrigerators BDS National Championships at Driving Addington. See driving section below for full details.

DRESS AND TURNOUT FOR RIDDEN CLASSES

HORSE

- a) No tack may be worn which in any way conceals an animal's conformation.
- b) No rugs, clothing or item of tack that reveals the identity of a horse or owner may be worn in the show ring.
- c) Martingales are only to be used on Working Hunters.
- d) The complete bridle must be plain leather.
- e) Swales, Sam Marsh bits and Gags with double bridles are actively discouraged. Bitless bridles are not allowed. Four and five year olds should be ridden in snaffle bridles.

RIDER

- f) Anyone on a horse must wear a skull cap or hat and safety harness according to the current approved BSI or European Standard at all times when mounted. Skull caps must have a navy blue or black cover.
- g) Riders must wear an appropriate jacket with a shirt and tie, tweed coat for men. Tweed coat or plain blue or black coat for women.
- h) Plain fawn or buff coloured breeches, not white
- i) Plain black or brown boots, garter straps optional
- j) Spurs are optional but at all times must be of smooth metal. There must be a shank, pointing only towards the rear, which must be no more than 3.5cm long and without rowels. The end must be blunt and incapable of wounding a horse. If the shank is curved, the spurs must be worn only with the shank directed downwards.
- k) Any form of leather or string glove
- l) No earrings or visible jewellery should be worn
- m) It is the responsibility of exhibitors to ensure that grooms entering the Show Ring are smartly and professionally turned out.

- 1 VETERAN HORSE OR PONY IN HAND 15 years of age or older. 10 marks available for each of turnout, walk, trot, 20 for condition, 20 for manners, 1 bonus mark for horses/ponies aged 19-22, 2 bonus marks for horses/ponies aged 23-26, 3 bonus marks for horses/ponies aged 27-30, 4 bonus marks for horses/ponies over 30. Age in years (of horse/pony) should be clearly displayed on exhibitors' armband or number.

Championship Award: 1st prize winners from classes 1 & 8 to compete for the Victoriana Trophy kindly presented by Mrs Katy Dukes, to be judged after class 8.

- 2 BEST CONDITION HORSE OR PONY IN HAND to be judged on condition and presentation.

- 3 COLOURED HORSE OR PONY (In hand). Open to Skewbald, Piebald horses/ponies ONLY, of any age.

This class is affiliated to Equifest and TSR

Award: The Paula Ware British Skewbald and Piebald Association Chairman's Salver

- 4 RESCUED AND REHOMES – open to any rescued equine. As well as official rescues, this includes those which have been abandoned, obtained or bought in a neglected/maltreated state and those saved from being destroyed by re-training. The equine may have been rescued by a charity and the re-homed with its current family. Entries should include brief details of the equine's history. "Before" photos would be useful but not essential. **In-hand or ridden.** Horse, pony, donkey or mule. Judging will be based on confidence, manners, condition and performance in company and in an individual show not exceeding two minutes. Judging will take account of the improvement in the animal since rescue.

- 5 TACK AND TURNOUT rider any age, horse or pony to be judged on presentation of horse, rider and equipment, regardless of type.
- 6 EQUITATION RIDDEN HEAVY HORSE to be judged by Equitation judge and Heavy horse judge.

PLEASE NOTE THERE WILL BE A 1 HOUR LUNCH BREAK FOR THE JUDGE IN RING 1, FOLLOWING CLASS 6 (AT APPROXIMATELY 12.30PM). DURING THIS TIME THE HEAVY HORSES WILL BE JUDGED IN THIS RING (CLASSES 12 to 18)

- 7** SIDE SADDLE RIDDEN OR LEAD REIN. To be judged on presentation of horse, rider and equipment regardless of rider age or type of horse
- 8** VETERAN HORSE OR PONY RIDDEN, 15 years of age or older 10 marks available for each of turnout, walk, trot, 20 for condition, 20 for manners, 1 bonus mark for horses aged 19-22, 2 bonus marks for horses aged 23-26, 3 bonus marks for horses aged 27-30, 4 bonus marks for horses/ponies over 30. Age in years (of horse) should be clearly displayed on exhibitors' armband or number.

Championship Award: 1st prize winners from classes 1 & 8 to compete for the Victoriana Trophy kindly presented by Mrs Katy Dukes, to be judged after class 8.

- 9** EQUITATION –SENIORS, rider 18 years or older, horse or pony, will be judged on riding ability and competitors will not be required to jump. Judged 50% on the turnout of horse/pony and rider and 50% on a freestyle show not exceeding 2 minutes to include (not limited to) halt, walk on a long rein, working trot serpentine, working canter circle on both reins and extended canter.

This class is affiliated to TSR.

- 10** EQUITATION - JUNIORS rider under 18 years of age on day of show, horse or pony, will be judged on riding ability and competitors will not be required to jump. Judged 50% on the turnout of horse/pony and rider and 50% on a freestyle show not exceeding 2 minutes to include (not limited to) halt, walk on a long rein, working trot serpentine, working canter circle on both reins.

- 11** RIDDEN RETRAINED EX RACEHORSE open to any thoroughbred that has been in training as a racehorse for 6 months or more before moving to its current role, horse to be judged on manners, condition and performance in company and in an individual show not exceeding 2 minutes. Horses will not be marked down for bumps and blemishes sustained during their racing career.
