Held at The Ings Sowerby Thirsk YO7 3AG

The Venue is located next door to Sowerby Caravan Park (the same side of the road) The Post code will take you further down the road.

There are Grey electric gates and a white Show Sign
Parking is on grass if firm or hard standing.

If you are coming down the A19 exit at Thirsk keep on the A19 heading towards York until you get to the Dalton/Sowerby junction on your right.

Do not turn off the A19 any sooner as you will get to a narrow bridge.

Rules

Once the entries close there are Strictly No refunds (Unless the event is cancelled then entry fees will be returned) **Entry fees are strictly non refundable and not transferable**

No Horse or Pony Under the age of 4 years of ages may be ridden on the show ground. Competitors must be a minimum age of 3 years of age.

Competitors in LR/FR Must use a snaffle Bridle and Lead rein attached to the nose band only

Any Stallions must be ridden/Handled by a competent person minimum age of 14

Handlers under 16 are required to wear a riding hat with safety harness fastened at all times.

Anyone riding on the premises must wear correct footwear.

Anyone riding on the property do so at their own risk. The owners of the property are not responsible for any accident or injury.

Spurs are permitted for over 16 years Old riders only.

Children under 16 Must be supervised at all times

For the Style and Performance Classes Competitors will jump the course of 8 fences and then perform a short show. They will be marked on style and performance not conformation. They will not be ridden. Rosettes 1st - 5th

Class.7 Tattersalls RoR Former Racehorse Challenge

Tattersalls RoR Former RACEHORSE CHALLENGE 2026

Open to all RoR and NR competition registered horses, Mare or gelding 4yrs old, any height. Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1st January 2025. Horses to be ridden in any suitable bridle and should be plaited. All entries must have current RoR Competition Registered. Racing injuries and blemishes ARE IGNORED in this series.

The first three go forward to the final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships, Aintree, August 2026

Prizes – RoR rosettes 1st–4th plus RoR official merchandise voucher 1st £20, 2nd £10, 3rd £5, Highest placed Veteran (15+) £10. Codes to be redeemed at the RoR office.

The Highest Placed Veteran also qualifies for the Tattersalls RoR Ridden Veteran Show final at the Jockey Club RoR National Championships on August 2026.

The Judge will NOT ride. Horses may be stripped for conformation at the discretion of the judge.

Competitors must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap. All those entering and/or participating in RoR classes agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force. The class to be judged **50%** jumping, **20%** Style while jumping and performance and **30% awarded** for show, manners and suitability to be retrained.

PHASE 1

Jumping to be judged:

8 rustic jumps 70cm to 80cm with a maximum spread of 75cm.

The following points to be deducted at the end of each jumping round:

10 points to be deducted for a knock down, 15 points to be deducted for a refusal, 20 points for second refusal. Elimination for third refusal or fall or Error of Course.

PHASE 2

Class returns without boots and judged for an individual show/conformation. *(In some classes, at the judge's discretion, horses might be asked to do a 'show' following their jumping without leaving the ring. This is often the case with a large number in the class)*

Each horse to complete an individual show of no longer than 1 ½ minutes. Show to include the following movements: walk, trot, canter showing change of leg, extended canter (gallop) halt and stand, walk off on long rein. Total marks out of **30%** for Show, manners and suitability to be retained. Fences for the final at Aintree can be up to a maximum of 85cm with a spread of 80cm.

Class 8. Best turned out

Class 9. Best Condition

Class 10. Novice Former Race Horse Not to have won an Affiliated Inhand Qualifier

Class 11. Beginners Inhand Class for those in their first season showing their former Race Horse

Class 12. Best Former Race Horse 4 years old and over

Class 13. Veteran Former Race Horse 15 Years and Over

Class 14. Horse & Country Inhand Qualifier - Open to Ex racehorses any age Handler 14 years and over

'The Horse & Country Racehorses (HCR) series is open to Thoroughbreds

2026:

- HCR members must carry their cards in the ring for signing at qualifying shows and be placed 1st-4th (qualifications may be passed down to 6th place)
- Non-members must send their qualification cards (presented by the judge if placed 1st-4th(6th)), fees and register with HCR before the entries close for the HCR Championship

15 Tattersalls RoR Open Inhand Qualifier

Tattersalls RoR OPEN In-Hand Show Series Qualifier 2026

Open to all RoR and NR **competition registered** horses, 3yrs and over, fillies, mares and geldings. Handlers must be 15 years or over on the 1st of January 2025.

Horses do not need to be shod to compete in the RoR Open In-Hand class. Horses can be shown in a bitless/ In-Hand Bridle. Blemishes caused by racing will be ignored.

All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force.

Handlers/grooms must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.

The first three go forward to the final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships at Aintree, August 22nd, 2026

Prizes – RoR rosettes 1st–4th plus Tattersalls RoR official merchandise voucher 1st £20, 2nd £10, 3rd £5, Highest placed Veteran (15+) £10

The Highest Placed Veteran also qualifies for the Tattersalls RoR Open In-Hand Veteran Show final at the Jockey Club RoR National Championships on August 22nd 2026

Ridden Classes

Class 16. Tack and Turnout (No Go Round)

Class 17. Novice Horse 4 years Old or over not to have won 3 firsts in RoR Affiliated Classes No Canter on the go round.

Class 18. Young Horse 4, 5 and 6 year old No cantering on the go round.

Class 19. Open Ridden Former Race Horse 4 years Old or over

Class 20. Veteran Former Race Horse 15 Years and Over

Class 21. Novice Ridden Qualifier

Tattersalls RoR NOVICE Ridden Show Series Qualifier 2026

Thoroughbred mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, any height, must have raced in GB and have current RoR Competition Membership. Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1st January 2026. **Horses will be ridden by the Judge** and will be stripped for conformation assessment. Horses to be ridden in a snaffle, pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavesson noseband. Horses should be plaited.

All those entering and/or participating in RoR classes agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force.

Competitors/grooms must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.

Racing injuries and blemishes are NOT ignored in this series

The first three go forward to the Final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships Aintree, August 22nd, 2026.

Prizes – RoR rosettes 1st–4th plus Tattersalls RoR official merchandise voucher 1st £30, 2nd £20, 3rd £10

To take part in this class, horses must NOT have won: a ridden open class under any affiliated showing society including (inc SEIB/HOYS, BSHA, SHB(GB) BSPS, BSPA, Tattersalls RoR Open /Amateur Ridden Show Series Qualifier, TARRA Ridden, or any other open class except Tattersalls RoR Challenge Show Series, other Working Hunter type classes or RoR In Hand classes. Unaffiliated Show wins are not considered.

Horses may remain in the Tattersalls RoR Novice Ridden Show Series (Formerly RoR Jockey Club Novice Show Series) classes until they have won three Tattersalls RoR Novice Show Series Qualifiers. They are de-noviced on their third novice win or at midnight on the day they win an open class, whichever happens first. They are still eligible to compete in the Tattersalls RoR Novice Final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships.

Class 22. Tattersalls Amateur Ridden Class

Tattersalls RoR AMATEUR Ridden Show Series Qualifier 2026

Open to all RoR and NR competition registered horses, 4yrs and over, mares and geldings, owned, produced and ridden by an **Amateur**. Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1st January 2026. Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, Pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavesson noseband. Horses should be plaited. Racing injuries and blemishes ARE IGNORED in this series.

The Series is open to AMATEUR riders only – those employed in racing will be allowed to compete. Class will be judged under 'riding horse' format without 'type' being taken into consideration. The Judge will not ride in the qualifiers but will ride in the Final. Competitors/grooms must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.

The first three go forward to the final at the Hickstead Derby Meeting, June 21st 2026

Prizes – RoR rosettes 1st–4th + RoR Tattersalls official merchandise voucher 1st £20, 2nd £10, 3rd £5, Highest placed Veteran (15+) £10.

The winner also qualifies for the Tattersalls RoR Amateur Ridden Special at the Jockey Club RoR National Championships on August 22nd, 2026. Highest Placed Veteran qualifies for the RoR Ridden Veteran Final on August 22nd, 2026

Amateur definition:

The rules are as in the rulebook with the following addition that an amateur may not show a horse owned or sponsored by a company or commercial firm. In addition, a person classed as an amateur must not be supported by a company in any way or act as a brand ambassador whether financially or in-kind. An amateur is a person who for the purpose of RoR classes does not/has not during the current season or previous season:

Engage(d) in breeding, livery, buying or selling, dealing or hiring horses in commercial capacity. Horses must not have been stabled at or reside in a Professional Producer's/Trainer's yard from January 1st, 2025. Riders must not have ridden any animals produced by a Professional/Trainer in the current or previous season. Horses and riders must not receive any help from a Professional Producer/Trainer at a SHOW in the current season. A rider who has ridden a Professional/Producer Trainer in the current or previous season must not have ridden horses at a show. Any breaches of this ruling will be taken seriously and will result in disqualification from future classes.

Class 23. Open RoR Ridden Qualifier

Tattersalls RoR Open Ridden Show Series Qualifier 2026

Open to RoR competition registered horses, 4yrs and over, mares and geldings, Thoroughbred mare or gelding, 4years old or over, any height. Riders must be 15 years or over by January 1st 2026. Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, Pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavesson noseband. Horses should be plaited.

The first THREE go forward to the championship at Hickstead on June 21st 2026.

All entries MUST be competition registered with the RoR and include their competition registration number on entry form and have RACED in GB. All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force. Please be aware that the show will split the class on the horse's last run in a race (NH or Flat) or will provide 2 ride judges should the entries exceed 20. Please mark your entry form

accordingly. Competitors must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.

Racing injuries and blemishes will NOT be ignored in this series

Prizes – RoR rosettes 1st –4th plus Tattersalls RoR official merchandise voucher 1st £30, 2nd £20, 3rd £10, Highest placed Veteran (15+) £10.

For qualifiers held after July 31st, 2025, the winner qualifies for the Tattersalls RoR Open Ridden Special at the Jockey Club RoR National Championships on August 22nd, 2026. The Highest Placed Veteran qualifies for the RoR Ridden Veteran Final on the same day.

Class 24 H&C Ridden Race Horse Affiliated Ridden Class

For ex Racehorses 4 years old and over any sex Riders 14 years and over

‘The Horse & Country Racehorses (HCR) series is open to Thoroughbreds and Standardbreds who have raced, trained or been bred to race. Racing injuries will be ignored providing the horse is sound. Riders must be 14 years plus, ridden horses must be 4 years plus and veterans are 12 years plus. Judges will not ride and you will not be asked to gallop as a ride but maybe asked to gallop in your individual show.

Qualifying shows are open to members and non-members.

In order to qualify for the HCR Championship Show at Netherton Equestrian, Perth on 5th / 6th September 2026:

- HCR members must carry their cards in the ring for signing at qualifying shows and be placed 1st-4th (qualifications may be passed down to 6th place)
- Non-members must send their qualification cards (presented by the judge if placed 1st-4th(6th)), fees and register with HCR before the entries close for the HCR Championship
