Held at The Ings Sowerby Thirsk YO7 3AG

The Venue is located next door to Sowerby Caravan Park (the same side of the road) The Post code will take you further down the road.

There are Grey electric gates and a white Show Sign
Parking is on grass if firm or hard standing.

If you are coming down the A19 exit at Thirsk keep on the A19 heading towards York until you get to the Dalton/Sowerby junction on your right.

Do not turn off the A19 any sooner as you will get to a narrow bridge.

Rules

Once the entries close there are Strictly No refunds (Unless the event is cancelled then entry fees will be returned) **Entry fees are strictly non refundable and not transferable**

Competitors enter Edenthorpe Equestrian premises at their own risk. The owner takes no responsibility for any loss or damage to persons, horses, vehicles or property whilst on the property.

No Horse or Pony Under the age of 4 years of ages may be ridden on the show ground. Competitors must be a minimum age of 3 years of age.

Competitors in LR/FR Must use a snaffle Bridle and Lead rein attached to the nose band only

Any Stallions must be ridden/Handled by a competent person minimum age of 14

All Riders to wear Correctly fitted headgear PAS015 or Higher whilst mounted anywhere on the show ground.

Handlers under 16 are required to wear a riding hat with safety harness fastened at all times.

Anyone riding on the premises must wear correct footwear.

Anyone riding on the property do so at their own risk. The owners of the property are not responsible for any accident or injury.

Spurs are permitted for over 16 years Old riders only.

Children under 16 Must be supervised at all times

- Please PICK UP any poo you create There are many skips available to use.
- DO NOT MUCK OUT TRAILERS & HORSEBOXES PLEASE
- Please keep dogs on leads at all times
- Strictly no lunging.
- YOU MUST NOT UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES TIE UP HAYNETS TO THE SIDE OF HORSE BOXES OR TRAILERS

2. RULES RELATING TO SHOW AFFILIATION

- 2.1 Rules numbered 2.3 – 2.6 MUST be printed in your show schedule and catalogue (if one is produced).
- 2.2 If the SPS-BS panel judge has a stud name included on our judges list, then this MUST be printed beside their name in the schedule.
- 2.3 Classes must be confined to SPS-BS registered ponies. Ponies must be named on the entry form and in the catalogue if one is produced. Society rosettes must only be given to ponies registered with the Society or to foals eligible for registration.
- 2.4 Three-year-old fillies with foals at foot may not be shown. All foals must be a minimum of three weeks old on the day of the Show.
- 2.5 To enter a stallion in ANY class (in-hand or performance) at an affiliated show, entire males aged 4 years old and over must have an “S” number and have been successfully through either the SPS-BS Stallion assessment prior to 2006 or the current SPS-BS Voluntary Veterinary Examination. Ridden stallions MUST display a stallion bridle badge. In hand colts/stallions of two years old or over must be shown bitted and are advised to display a colt or stallion bridle badge, these are available to purchase from the SPS-BS.
- 2.6 There must be no colts or stallions in Young Handlers classes. **Young Handlers must be a minimum of 3 years of age on the day of the show. Children under 14 years old may not show colts (excluding foals) or Stallions in In-hand classes. Children aged under 12 years old on the day of their class may not show a stallion in ridden classes. In the interests of safety, hard hats conforming to current British Safety standards must be worn, correctly secured, by all handlers aged 14 years or under in In-hand classes. For Health & Safety purposes judges and exhibitors must remain standing whilst in the ring when showing ponies. KNEELING IS NOT PERMITTED. Hard hats conforming to current British Safety standards must be worn, correctly secured, by all exhibitors, irrespective of age, in ridden classes.** Ridden and driven ponies must be 4 years old or over. In ridden Classes, if a rider falls off at any time whilst in the ring, both pony and rider must leave the ring, rider dismounted, and take no further part.
- 2.7 A SCHEDULE, OR DRAFT OF SCHEDULE, MUST ACCOMPANY ALL APPLICATIONS FOR AFFILIATION. Society rosettes may only be awarded by SPS-BS Panel Judges who must be members of the SPS-BS, except for NPS M&M Panel Judges who may judge only mixed breed classes and can award “Best Shetland” rosettes.
- 2.8 **If you intend to invite an overseas judge please ensure they are on the SPS-BS International Judges Panel.**
