- HANDY PONY / HORSE Riders 13 years & over. Rosettes for all Riders will have to dismount to retrieve any competition items dropped in error.

SASHES are kindly sponsored by Yorkshire Dales Ice Cream and will be awarded to the winners in all classes with 6 or more entrants.

RULES - 2025

- Payment of entry fees indicate the agreement of competitors and spectators not to hold the organisers liable or responsible for any loss, damage or accident incurred by any persons or property on the show field and/or parking field.
- Competitors take part entirely at their own risk. It is now compulsory that all riding hats must display a BRC kite mark and to be Standard PAS015 (2011) or above. It is essential that all chin straps / safety harness must be fastened at all times, when mounted. <u>Please note that riding hats</u> to Standard PAS015 (1998) and Snell E2001 are no longer accepted and need replacing.
- 3. The term JUNIOR means all competitors who are aged 3 to15 years on 1st January are eligible to compete as a junior until the end of the calendar year. It is now COMPULSORY for all JUNIOR riders to wear body protectors when competing in any class where jumping is involved and during any practise outside the rings. It is strongly recommended that body protectors are worn by other age groups, for all classes BUT those with a BETA 2000 or 2009 tags are no longer legal in British Eventing, Pony Clubs or British Riding Club Events. We strongly advise that you wear the new Standard Body Protector BETA 2018 when competing at our Association's events. JUNIOR riders are NOT ALLOWED to wear SPURS in any class.
- Judges' decision, in respect of each class, will be final. ANY objections should be made in writing to the Chairman, together with a deposit of £10 which will be refunded if the objection is upheld.
- 5. All breaches of the rules, matters of discipline and objections shall be referred to a stewards committee, comprising either the President or Chairman, and any two other committee members. Their decision shall be final and binding and shall be notified direct to the person(s) concerned.
 Bad language will NOT be tolerated on the showfield.
- 6. The Organisers reserve the right to refuse entries considered to be unsuitable for any class or to **expel** from the field any person or horse/pony behaving in a manner likely to adversely affect the safety or enjoyment of others.
- 7. Family Membership means Parent/Guardian and children (i.e. immediate family only).
- 8. Points towards the Championship will only be awarded to **PAID UP** members of IDRA in current year. Once payment has been received, each member will be sent a membership card and a corresponding Back Number. These Back Numbers are to be used on show days during the year by the individual named on the reverse side. Please keep these Back Numbers safe and ready for use as Replacement Numbers will cost you £5.
- Points will be cumulative in respect of the same horse/pony and rider. Please ensure the same show name is used throughout the season when entering or points will be split between given equine Names and you could lose those valuable points.
- 10. Points will be awarded in each class (except Clear Round classes). One point will be awarded for each class entered and <u>presented in the ring</u>. Points and rosettes will be awarded to the first four places 1st 5 points; 2nd 4 points; 3rd 3 points; 4th 2 points. If there are six or more entries in any class, a sash will also be awarded to the winner, kindly sponsored by Yorkshire Dales Ice Cream. Double points for all placings (1st 4th) will be awarded ONLY at the SEPTEMBER SHOW. If there are any joint points placings at the end of the season, ie 1st = then the next placing will be 3rd etc.
- 11. The person named on the entry sheet must take the horse/pony into the ring. Any changes must be advised to the Judge and changed by the Ring Steward or Secretary before entering the ring.
- 12. Ring Championships all qualified riders must be mounted to take part in any Ridden Ring Championship. When a rider qualifies on more than one horse/pony in the same Championship, the owner/rider must choose which animal to enter on, as it is the winning <u>rider/horse/pony combination only</u> allowed to compete for the championship (i.e. no substitute rider or led in hand).
 Same applies for Ring 3 In Hand Championship only the winning handler may compete.
- 13. NO COLTS or STALLIONS or horse/pony suspected of any illness are allowed on the showfield. No horse/pony under 4 years can be entered in any ridden classes. Any horse/pony found to be causing problems or is deemed dangerous, will be asked to leave the show ground.

- 14. Jumping batons, riding whips or showing canes used in any class in any ring must not exceed 70cm (28") Cruelty to any horse/pony or excessive use of the riding whips and/or spurs, immediately disgualifies entry.
- 15. No cantering is allowed on the track to Rings 2 & 1. Cantering is only allowed in the schooling area and in the Rings. It can be dangerous to canter outside these areas and might result in being asked to leave the show field, forfeiting any entry fees already paid.
- 16. No horse/pony may be entered more than once for any class, although one rider may enter more than one different horse/pony (except in the Clear Rounds and Handy Pony classes).
- 17. **Show Jumping Ring 1**. Refusals in the show jumping will incur the following penalties:

 1st refusal = 4 faults; 2nd refusal = 4 faults and 3rd refusal = elimination. Jumping the wrong course;

 Starting before the Bell; Fall of rider and/or horse/pony are all elimination. **RIDERS ARE NOT ALLOWED**to re-mount in the ring under any circumstances. All classes, unless mentioned, in Ring 1 are now run as 2 round competitions with the 2nd round being the Timed Jump Off round and jump heights may be raised (i.e. BSJA Table A7).
- Riders must declare to the Collecting Ring Steward BEFORE walking the course in Ring 1.
 Only those riders competing in the current class will be permitted in Ring 1 Collecting Area.
- 19. Once a pony has been entered into a horse class it may not then be re-entered in a pony class and vice-versa that season. A senior rider may compete a pony in a horse class provided that pony has not competed in a pony class with any rider that season. A rider may compete on horses in the show jumping classes from the beginning of the calendar year in which the age of 12 is reached.
- 20. Junior riders (15yrs & under) riding ponies not exceeding 148cms MUST only compete in the junior jumping classes. Riders (16yrs & over) may compete on a 148cms pony in the senior classes.
- 21. Competitors are only allowed to enter **THREE consecutive jumping classes** on the same horse/pony in either Show Jumping classes in Ring 1 or Working Hunter classes in Ring 2.
- 22. Non-competitive entries will NOT be allowed in any classes.
- 23. If your horse/pony is known to kick out when crowded, you MUST TIE A RED RIBBON on the tail to warn other riders to stay clear. A GREEN RIBBON means the horse/pony is a novice and a YELLOW RIBBON on mane and/or tail means that the rider has communication issues.
- 24. NO SPURS ALLOWED. This appears against a large number of our classes in all three rings. Junior jumping classes, junior rider classes (see Rule 3), all Mountain & Moorland classes, some working hunter classes, ridden veteran class and all equitation classes.
- 25. All Equitation classes have to be ridden in a snaffle bridle with a cavesson noseband and No Spurs.
- 26. Lead Rein Classes All riders entered in Lead Rein classes MUST stay in lead rein classes throughout that show day. The leader **MUST be 16 years or over** and stay the same person throughout the season. If you qualify as a Lead Rein Champion for STARS, please read their Rule 6.
- Entries for Points Shows can be made online and is available for everyone until FRIDAY before show days. Then all entries will be taken on the day. All entries are NON REFUNDABLE.
- 28. Measurement of horse/pony may be taken at any time at the Judges' discretion or at the Committee's request.
- 29. Late entries **MAY** be taken at the Judges' discretion.
- 30. NO fires, barbecues / naked flames allowed on IDRA field or Nell Bank Field except for our caterers.
- 32. If you **Do Not** wish photographs to be taken of you and/or your family, you must inform our Official Photographers. Photographs taken by our official photographer may appear in the public domain and on the Club's social media sites to advertise and publicise Ilkley & District Riding Association.
- 33. RIDERS ARE NOT ALLOWED TO RE-MOUNT IN <u>ANY CLASS</u>, IN ANY RING, UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES.

It is for your CONVENIENCE AND SAFETY. Please comply with these few simple RULES:

- 1. MAXIMUM SPEED LIMIT IS 5mph.
- 2. If you lose traction ASK for assistance. DO NOT tear up the turf. It's not ours!
- 3. Obey the 'MARSHALS', they are there to assist you.
- 4. Horses/ponies may be ridden in the warm up areas provided. When riding to and from the show field, please make sure that you only **WALK**.

As we borrow the parking field from Nell Bank, the agreement is that it has to be left clear of any rubbish and droppings after our shows. HEALTH & SAFETY STATEMENT FOR I.D.R.A.

- 1. The Organiser has the overall responsibility for Health and Safety.
- 2. The event is organised in accordance with Health and Safety Legislation and all who have (to any extent) control of premises or site at the event are responsible for ensuring that:
 - Everything reasonably practicable is done to ensure the health and safety and welfare of those attending the event;
 - b) They conduct themselves so that they do not put themselves or anyone else at risk;
 - c) Access to and from the site is safe;
 - d) Members of the public and competitors are responsible for ensuring that they do not put other persons at risk and that they co-operate with the organisers in compliance with Health and Safety Legislation.

50th PRESENTATION EVENING

After presenting the Class Championship Trophies and Rosettes these trophies will be awarded

THE SUGAR PLUM MEMORIAL TROPHY

will be awarded to the **junior rider** who has entered the most **ridden** classes (including show jumping/working hunter classes) during the season with the same horse/pony. Sorry but entries in any Clear Round Jumping will not be counted. This trophy was initially presented in 2013 to commemorate the loss of Carol Dawson's dog - **Sugar Plum** (who was accidentally kicked by her horse and killed). This Trophy is a reminder of the potential dangers of loose dogs around horses.

THE SENIOR RIDDEN POINTS TROPHY

Will be awarded to the **senior rider** who has entered the most **Ridden** classes (show jumping/working hunter and flat classes) during the season with the samehorse/pony. Same ruling as for the Sugar Plum Memorial Trophy – entries in any Clear Round Jumping classes will **not** be counted.

THE IN-HAND JUNIOR and SENIOR HANDLER TROPHIES

will be awarded to the **Junior** and **Senior handler** who have entered the most **In-Hand** classes (with the same horse/pony) during this season.

THE FOLLOWING TROPHIES (chosen by your Committee) will also be awarded

THE MRS BARBARA SUTHERLAND TROPHY

will be awarded to the **most improved rider of the year**

THE LOUIE LAMBERT TROPHY

will be awarded to the **Best Lead Rein to First Ridden Combination Rider**

THE ENDEAVOUR TROPHY

will be awarded to **a member** who has shown tremendous effort and determination throughout the season

THE BISCUIT MEMORIAL TROPHY

Given by Barbara Montford, to be awarded to **A Horse or Pony of Special Merit**

THE ROSEMARY TROPHY

will be awarded to **someone** who has gone above and beyond during the season

THE DAVID KEMPLAY HERITAGE TROPHIES

will be awarded to a grandparent and **member** grandchild where the knowledge of the equine world is passed down through their family

STARS Champion of Champions 20th – 23rd November 2025 Rules and Conditions of Qualification and Entry

- **RULE 1a** Qualification will be taken from points accrued over the season which give rise to your champion, reserve champion, and 2nd reserve champion. Each club MUST offer the option of representing their club to each class champion. Should they be unable to attend you may pass down to the reserve champion and 2nd reserve champion. Each club is allowed to send 1 competitor for each class. If you have 2 competitors with equal marks, then both can enter IF we have capacity, please check with STARS. If we can't accommodate both entries it will be determined by the competitor that attended the most points shows. If they both attended the same amount, then send the one that won the most first places.
- RULE 1b Show dates must run between March and September 2025.
- **RULE 1c** No points shows can be held after 17th September 2025.
- RULE 1d Entries for STARS will open on 18th September and close on 2nd October 2025
- **RULE 2b** All competitors must attend a minimum of 2 points shows.
- In addition to the above rules, we have noticed that many RC's run a non-points trophy show mid-season, can we ask if possible that your trophy shows be held in September so that all show secretaries have plenty of time to invite their competitors to represent them at STARS, this also enables each competitor to know if they have qualified when entries and stabling opens on 18th September.
- RULE 3 Any competitor may compete in more than 1 class at STARS providing they meet the criteria for each class. Each competitor can represent as many RCs as they want.
- RULE 4 Competitors must be current members of each club/clubs they represent.
- **RULE 5** It is a condition of affiliation that all RC secretaries keep records of their points for each class and a running points total sheet must be available at each show or online throughout the season, for competitors and STARS admin. At STARS Final these sheets need to be always available.
- **RULE 6** No change of combination of horse/pony/rider is permitted from that which qualified through their club. The leader of a LR pony may be substituted under exceptional circumstances arise with permission from STARS.
- RULE 7a No horse or pony, rider/handler can compete at STARS if they have qualified HOYS in any class including search for a star in 2025 or 2024.

Horses and ponies that qualified for HOYS in 2023 are eligible provided they were not placed. Search For a Star placings are allowed.

- RULE 7b Riders/handlers cannot have ridden/led any animal at HOYS in 2025, riding/leading any other year is permitted
- **RULE 8** No horse or pony that has been placed in the top 5 at the RIHS in current year can compete at STARS. Riders can complete on a different horse or pony.
- **RULE 9a** No professional producers can compete at STARS, or any horse or pony that is in, or has been in production from 1st March 2025. The definition of a professional producer is as follows: The horse or pony is kept at a producer's yard on show production or for any other reason including being broken, holiday livery etc. The horse or pony is prepared for a show, bathed, plaited, etc, horse or pony has been taken to a show. Horse or pony has been worked in or tuition given to owner/rider at a show. Horse or pony stripped, or assistance given in the ring. If any of the above applies to your horse, then they are not eligible to come to STARS.

We do allow full livery on a professional yard provided it is NOT a showing yard. We understand some people work long hours and need full livery inc. Exercise, however, no-show production of any kind is allowed.

- **RULE 9b** Semi Professionals, any competitor that shows 2 or more animals for other people regardless if you take payment for your services or not, we class you as a semi-professional. Semi-professionals are not eligible to compete at STARS. We do not mind how many horses or ponies you show if they belong to you, and we do not want to stop friends from helping each other but it cannot be more than 1 friend.
- **RULE 9c** No competitor can have shown a horse or pony that belongs or is produced by a professional producer at any show in 2025.

STARS was created for the home-produced, amateurs and true-grassroots competitors. We ask people to take this rule in the spirit intended and we will disqualify anyone who we feel is bending the rules. If we feel any situation is a grey area and not fully covered by our rules, then each case will be determined by STARS and our decision will be final.

- **RULE 10a** Complaints procedure: Anyone who wishes to make a complaint must be a fully paid-up member of an affiliated RC or a secretary of an affiliated RC.
- RULE 10b Any complaints made prior to STARS must be done via email to STARS admin. If we feel the complaint needs a full investigation, we will then ask for a £50 administration fee to be paid.
- RULE 10c Any complaints made at STARS must be done within 1 hour of the alleged complaint.
- RULE 10d Any one needing to complain can go to our Help Desk or go to the marquee and ask for the official dealing with complaints. The complaint must be accompanied by £50 and given in person to the correct official who will be dealing with the complaint. If the complaint is upheld the money will be returned if not, it will be donated to a horse charity of our choice.
- RULE 11 Social media rules: You must not post or transmit any material which could damage the name or reputation of STARS or its competitors/organisers. Any person found guilty of this would constitute a breach of STARS rules and could result in civil/criminal proceedings being brought against you.

- RULE 12 Any stallions must be ridden/handled by a competent person with a minimum age of 14.
- **RULE 13** Full and correct attire must be worn by all competitors and their grooms. All riders must wear correctly fitting headgear to PAS015 or higher, whilst mounted anywhere on the showground. Junior members MUST wear them when competing in hand. Grooms must wear suitable hats when attending in the ring.
- **RULE 14** No horse or pony under 4 may be ridden on the showground. All ponies ages are from 1st Jan, it does not matter what month they are born, it goes on year of birth. Competitors must be a minimum age of 3 years of age to ride any horse or pony on the showground. Anyone leading a LR pony must be 16 or over. Riders in LR/FR classes MUST use a snaffle bridle.
- **RULE 15** Ages of the horse/pony will be 1st January in the current year.
- RULE 16 Spurs are permitted for senior riders only (Aged over 18).
- RULE 17 Excessive use of whips is forbidden and will result in disqualification. Whips must not exceed 75cm.
- **RULE 18** Fall of a horse/pony in any class requires the horse/pony to be led from the ring. The competitor will be eliminated
- **RULE 19a** Any person who conducts themselves in a manner which may be deemed to bring the show into disrepute. Any person who is acting in a manner that may be abusive to any animal, person, official judge or steward will be disqualified and escorted off the showground.
- **RULE 19b** Any person who behaves in a manner that is offensive to our judges or officials will be asked to leave the ring/showground. We will NOT tolerate competitors who are rude to our judges and stewards.

Under no circumstances will shouting/booing from the audience, competitors or anyone else attending the show be allowed. It is bad manners and bad sportsmanship and this behaviour will not be tolerated. Anyone found guilty of this will be asked to leave the show immediately.

- RULE 20 No person who has a conviction or pending conviction for animal cruelty will be permitted to compete.
- RULE 21 No late competitors will be allowed into the ring in any ridden class in which the initial trot has commenced:

 Likewise, for in hand sections, no late competitors will be allowed in the ring after the first horse has begun its trot out.
- RULE 22 The organisers and judges reserve the right to refuse an entry in the event on any unsoundness.
- RULE 23 The ruling of STARS judges/officials is FINAL. STARS reserves the right to substitute judges as necessary.
- RULE 24 The organisers reserve the right to amalgamate or substitute classes as deemed appropriate.
- RULE 25a Working in times must be adhered to for each section.
- RULE 25b No lunging anywhere on the showground.
- RULE 25c No riding or walking on the racecourse itself. If this rule is broken, you will be asked to leave the show ground.
- RULE 26 No dogs are allowed in any arenas, buildings, stables or racecourse.

We ask you only to bring your dog if you have no other option. All dogs must be always kept in horseboxes unless being exercised and/or taken for toilet breaks. Dogs must always be on a lead.

- **RULE 27a** You must park where directed by parking stewards, any abuse to parking staff will result in being asked to leave the showground without exception.
- **RULE 27b** On arrival at the showground any person found to be rude, aggressive or uncooperative with any official from Aintree or STARS will results in being asked to leave the showground.
- **RULE 28** Official walkways MUST be adhered to. No persons are allowed in the horse walkways unless they are riding or leading a horse or pony.
- RULE 29 Pushchairs and prams are discouraged near horses and ponies.
- **RULE 30** Neither the organisers, landowners, committee or agents of the show accept any liability for any accident, loss, damage, injury or illness to horses/ponies, any person, owner, rider, handler, spectator, land or property whatsoever, whether caused by negligence, breach of contract or in any way whatsoever.
- **RULE 31** Exhibitors shall take good care of, and shall not cause any damage, or suffer any damage to be done to the site/showground or to any furniture, fittings, equipment, stables or other property therein. Anyone causing damage shall be responsible to pay for any damage including (accidental damage) caused by an act of neglect or in use.
- **RULE 32** Trophies are perpetual and MUST be returned in good clean condition, duly engraved where applicable by 15th September.
- **RULE 33** No entries will be accepted without the correct fee and first aid contribution. First aid will be charged per competitor per day.
- RULE 34 ENTRY FEES ARE NON-REFUNDABLE UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES.
- RULE 35 Judging/scoring of classes:
- Ridden/In-Hand Show Classes: 50% type and conformation, 50% ride or show, manners and way of going.

 Best Turned Out: 30% cleanliness, condition and correctness of tack, 30% cleanliness and neatness of rider and handler if on LR, 10% overall impression, 30% pony/horse.
- Young Handler: 50% ability of handler, 25% suitability of age/height/manners of pony, 25% overall impression <u>Equitation</u>: 50% riders use of seat and aids, 25% riders' position, 25% suitability of partnership and overall impression.
- RULE 36 ALL COMPETITORS will be deemed to have read and accepted these rules as a condition of entry.

All IDRA qualifying classes for STARS are highlighted QSTARS. Where classes have different breeds / types / heights / rider's age / etc., we will split accordingly.

The **TWO** highest eligible placed exhibits not already qualified in the classes listed below, will qualify for the relevant Equifest Championships.

In order to enter Equifest Championship classes, competitors need to compete in a qualifying class at an affiliated show. Riders are responsible to get their own qualification card signed by the judge in the ring, when the class has finished. Please note that IDRA class wording MIGHT NOT be the same as Equifest classes, i.e. different rider ages, different equine heights, show/ridden cob need to be hogged and trimmed, Coloured classes are only for Piebald and Skewbald, etc.

Please double check that you are eligible to qualify, at IDRA shows, for your chosen classes at Equifest.



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
