In all Ridden & Inhand showing, Qualifiers may be presented to the 1st and 2nd placed competitors.

Awards may be passed down the line only at the judges discretion but only as far as 6th place.

On qualifying the Competitor will be handed a registration certificate that maybe completed online at www.midarc.co.uk, competitors without internet should send written details of their qualification to the office within 21 days of qualifying. It is essential that all relevant information should be filled in, email addresses should be printed and clear. The organisers will have no responsibility for any incorrect email addresses. Traditional Gypsy Cob Association (TGCA) Show Number

TGCA TOYS In

Hand and Ridden Classes No known breeding required to enter these classes TGCA Breed classes are qualifiers for the Best of Breed Finals at the Traditional Gypsy Cob Association's (TGCA) National Breed Championship Show "TOYS". Classes are open to all traditional gypsy cobs. Part Bred classes, are open to all part bred traditional gypsy cobs and are qualifiers for the part bred finals at "TOYS". The exhibit must have one parent that is bred traditional gypsy cob. Stallions-All stallions (four years and over) in order to enter any TGCA affiliated class MUST have be TGCA registered, have passed TGCA evaluations and their TGCA stallion disc displayed on their bridle Stallions and colts over the age of two, MUST be shown in a stallion bridle with a metal bit and chain lead as per the current TGCA rulebook. Current TGCA members must present their qualification card to the judge in the ring for signature. Nonmembers MUST receive a qualification card from the judge and have 21 days to join the TGCA and register their horse to validate the qualification. Please refer to www.tgca.co.ukfor further details including membership, horse registration and showing rules (contained within the members handbook). Championship Shows 1st, 2nd and 3rd from the TGCA classes may go forward to the Quest for a Star Championship, provided they are current TGCA members and the horse is TGCA registered. Membership cards and qualification cards (specific to that exhibit) must be presented upon entry into the ring. The Champion and Reserve qualify for the Ultimate Star Championships at TOYS. Go for Glory Championship - PB -1st, 2nd and 3rd from the TGCA part bred classes may go forward to the Go for Glory Championship. For TOYS qualifiers, the handler/rider and exhibits (apart from stallions) do not have to be TGCA members/registered on the date of the show. The Champion and Reserve qualify for the Crowning Glory Championships at TOYS.

<u>Class 4:</u> Coloured Horse/Pony – piebald, skewbald, plaited, traditional, native or hogged.

Class 5: Alternative Coloured – spots, roan, dun, palomino.

Class 6: Mountain & Moorland.

Class 7: Foreign Breeds.

Class 8: Young Handler – 16 years and under, handlers MUST wear a hard hat.

Class 9: Miniature horse/Shetlands. (Judged as a Split Class, Flower Sash to Both).

#Rules & conditions

- 1. Entries accepted at riders/ handler's risk.
- <u>2.</u> The organisers or its officials cannot be responsible for damage loss or injury to persons, property or animals due.
- to accident or any other cause.
- <u>3.</u> All horses or ponies must be four years old or over if ridden on the showground.
- <u>4.</u> Horses or ponies must not be left unattended tied to lorries/trailers on the lorry park.
- <u>5.</u> Any objection must be made in writing with £50 deposit within 30 Minutes of Incident to be forfeited if the objection is not upheld, or is frivolous.
- <u>6.</u> All junior competitors 18 years and under must wear a correctly secured current British standard riding hat whilst mounted or in hand regardless of association.
- <u>7.</u> Earrings or facial piercings must not be worn.
- 8. Chaps are not permitted.
- 9. No running martingales or draw reins to be worn.
- 10. Riders must have attained their 3rd birthday.
- 11. All ages of horses/ponies and children are taken as of the 1st January 2023 unless stated otherwise, for example not to have attained Birthday by 1st January 2023.
- <u>12.</u> In lead rein classes the lead must be attached to the nose band only. Snaffle bits only.
- 13. No galloping on the show ground except as required by the judge.
- <u>14.</u> The judge's decision is final.
- 15. All stallions must be bitted.
- <u>16.</u> Equine passports must be carried and may be subject to checks, vaccinations are advisory but we recommend annually. Foals are not required for vaccinations below 6 months.
- <u>17.</u> The show operates a zero-abuse tolerance level, any offenders will be asked to leave the show ground with no financial reimbursements made.
- 18. Handlers of Colts/Stallions must wear a white armband.
- <u>19.</u> Supreme of Show Trophy and Reserve Supreme <u>WILL</u> require a deposit of £20 each in which will be returned the following year on return of the trophies.
- 20. Riding hats to be current safety standard Bsi Kitemarked PAS015.
- <u>21.</u> Disclaimer to be filled out upon entering the concours d'elegance class if the correct standard hat isn't being worn.

Health Safety & Welfare

The organisers of this event have taken every reasonable precaution to ensure the health and safety of everyone

present. For these measures to be effective everyone must take reasonable precaution to avoid and prevent accidents

occurring and must obey the instructions of the organisers, officials and stewards

Entry fees

All class entry fees are £10 on the day and £8 in advance. Please see entry form. Entry fees are cash only on show day.

Timings

Late entry into a ring is at the discretion of the judge.

Competitors must be present for the final walk round to be placed.

The showground

Please adhere to steward's instructions when moving or parking lorries. The ground is very uneven and the best routes have been identified and marked. If extreme weather conditions have been experienced in the 7 days prior to the show we have the right to cancel the horse show section.

Show Protocol

- Our judges will never touch your horses.
- Never share items at shows with persons from other yards to minimize any infection.
- If your horse seems unwell "off colour" please do not bring/ attend the show.
- Please bring enough forage/ water for your horse/pony, we do have a tap for water on the showground, but please do not share buckets.
- Please keep space between yourselves prior to classes and in working in areas.
- Its all basic common sense, but all of the above are often seen at all events, so do your bit to protect you and your horse.
- No cantering anywhere on the showground except the showring and warm up ring.
