NOTICE TO ALL EXHIBITORS FROM ALL SECTIONS

The safety of the public at our Agricultural Show has always been of much concern to us, the organisers, but now has become a matter of paramount importance in relation to Public Liability Insurance and the Health & Safety at Work Act 1974 with additions and amendments to this legislation. Wolsingham Show presents many difficult problems because of its size in terms of numbers of visitors, exhibitors, numbers and types of livestock and machinery present at the Show.

In order to meet legal and insurance requirements, it has been necessary to introduce arrangements to segregate, as far as practicably possible, the general public from livestock. The society has appointed a team of stewards – Stewards of Safety – to supervise the implementation of these measures. These stewards will control the movement of people and livestock to and from different areas of the show ground. THE DIRECTIONS OF THE STEWARDS OF SAFETY MUST BE ADHERED TO BY ALL EXHIBITORS AND VISITORS.

It is in your own interests to comply with the stewards' instructions and to observe the procedures laid down by Wolsingham Show. We would appreciate your full co-operation with this. However, should any exhibitor refuse to comply with the instructions of the Stewards of Safety, The Society will have no alternative but to immediately remove them from the Show Ground. Furthermore, the exhibitor's entries and all fees paid or prizes won will be forfeited. This condition will be strictly enforced and no appeal will be entertained.

Each section of animal showing categories will have their own individual rules and these will be found in that section of the schedule. Again, these must all be strictly adhered to.

Details of the routes to be taken around each specific showing area on the show field will be laid out by the section secretaries and clearly signposted. Routes from parking areas to penning areas and respective showing areas will be clearly marked. You are urged to familiarise yourself with these and to seek advice/assistance of the Stewards of Safety if you are in any doubt about any aspect of this matter. By order of the Society.

IN THE EVENT OF CANCELLATION OF THE EVENT 50% REFUND WILL BE GIVEN TO ALL EXHIBITORS.

(excluding BSJA)

We welcome all entries to the 245th Wolsingham Show.

Horse classes will run throughout the day on Saturday 6th and Sunday 7th September 2025.

- Entries can be made via post or online via <u>www.horses.wolsinghamshow.co.uk</u> –
 Entries will open on 1st June 2025, closing date 16th August 2025. No late entries will be accepted.
- Online entries will carry a booking fee. Postal entries will only be accepted upon receiving entry, fee and stamped address envelope.
- Prize money will be given in the form of an Ice Bank Cheque, which must be cashed over the weekend at the Ice Bank on the show ground.
- Trophies will be held for 1 year. Winners of trophies will be expected to take part in the Grand Parade at the end of each day before receiving the trophy.
- All online entries will receive QR codes via email, which are to be scanned at the entrance gate. These will be emailed once entries have closed.
- Timetable will be displayed via the show website and Facebook page in the week previous to the show.
- All children entering classes must be accompanied by an adult.
- All riders must wear a correct standard hat at all times.
- All horses entering the showground must be accompanied with a correct passport and be microchipped.
- It is compulsory that all horses entering the showground should have up to date tetanus and equine influenza vaccinations.
- Correct show etiquette is expected at all times and the judges decision is final.
- Classes affiliated to specific bodies must follow rules provided in their given rule book.
- No animal suffering from a contagious disease may be brought onto the showground.
 In the event of veterinary surgeon advising the removal of any animal from the show, decision should be final and complied with immediately.
- Any stallions must be ridden/handled by a competent person with a minimum age of 14 years. Any person participating in any way at this Show who conducts themselves in a manner which may be deemed to bring the show into disrepute, or who is acting in a way which may be abusive to any animal, person, official, judge, steward will be disqualified and escorted off the showground.
- The organisers and judges reserve the right to refuse an entry in the event of any unsoundness such as lameness, coughing or dangerous behaviour ect.
- You must park where directed by ground crew.
- Any person wishing to make a complaint, must do so on the day of the event, within 30 minutes of the alleged complaint, accompanied by £20 administration fee, which will be refunded if the complaint is upheld.
- All dogs MUST be kept on leads.
- Push chairs and prams are discouraged near any horse/ponies.
- Official walkways MUST be adhered to. No persons are allowed in the horse walkways unless they are riding or leading a horse/pony.
- Neither the organisers, Landowners, Committee or Agents of the show accept liability for any accident, loss, damage, injury or illness to horses/ponies, any person, owner, rider, handler, spectator, land or property whatsoever, whether caused by negligence, breach of contract or in any way whatsoever.
- ALL COMPETITORS will be deemed to have read and accepted these rules as a condition of entry

1. Private Driving

Horse or pony, 4 years old or over, driven to a traditional or traditional type vehicle. A traditional vehicle means a vehicle of traditional profile and identifiable type to resemble the design of a carriage built prior to the First World War. The vehicle may be made from modern materials but must have traditional style springing and carriage lamps. Pneumatic tyred vehicles, trade turnouts and show wagons are not eligible.

2. Tradesman's Turnout

Open to horses and ponies, 4 years old or over, singles and pairs to a traditional or traditional type trade vehicle. No goods to be carried or displayed. A small sample load may be carried on a coster turnout only.

3. Exercise Vehicles

Open to horses & ponies, 4 years old or over. A single, pair or tandem driven to a carriage of non-traditional type design and includes those with pneumatic tyres specifically designed for carriages (i.e., not car tyres). Lamps need not be carried. Judging will include general cleanliness, safety of turnout, correct fitting of harness and vehicle suitability.

4. Concours D 'Elegance

Open to singles, pairs, multiples, 4 years old or over, to a traditional type vehicle. The essence of the class is the word 'elegance' and the winner will be the turnout, which, in the opinion of the Judge, presents the most elegant effect. To include vehicle, horse, driver, passenger etc. but above all the general impression. Attention may be paid to drivers/passengers' personal costume, but fancy dress or period costume is definitely barred. The whole object of the class is to establish which turnout presents the most pleasing picture and normal judging criteria does not apply. It is judged from a distance and vehicles are NOT closely inspected. To be driven at park pace.

A competent, experienced adult groom aged 18 years or over to be carried at all times. The driver must be aged 8 years or over on the first day of the show at which they are to compete. A driver under the age of 18 must be accompanied in the vehicle by a competent and responsible person aged 18 years or over, a "responsible adult".

Proof of age will be required if necessary. It is the responsibility of the owner/driver (if over 18) or (if the owner/driver is under 18) the responsible adult to ensure that his/her groom/s is/are competent for the purpose of attending to the turnout and aged 8 or over on the day of the show. When in the vehicle grooms, passenger/s and driver must have their feet firmly on the floor of the vehicle or use a suitable fixed footrest. This regulation applies at all times and in all areas on the showground. All drivers/grooms/passengers under the age of 14 years must wear a correctly fitted hard hat when in a carriage or in attendance to a turnout.
