RING 1 – IN HAND CLASSES

Start 9.00am — Judge: Janet Smithers

Class 1: BEST TURN OUT AND CONDITION

This class will be judged on the turn out of the horse and the handler! The horse will also be judged on condition but not conformation.

Class 2: NOVICE

NOT to have won more than THREE times as a Horse/Pony Combination

Class 3: YOUNGSTER - BEST YEARLING

Two and three year old qualify Colt, Filly or Gelding

Class 4: SENIOR

15 years +

Class 5: COLOURED

Open to any Piebald, Skewbald, Appaloosa, Palomino, Paints, Spots, Duns or coloured horse or pony.

Class 6: COB/COB TYPE

Show/Hogged or Traditional

Class 7: THOROUGHBRED AND PART BREEDS

Class 8: M&M SMALL AND LARGE BREEDS

To be shown in natural state. Large and small breeds (incl. Shetlands) to be shown together. Will split class if sufficient numbers.

Class 9: FOREIGN BREEDS, RARE BREEDS AND PART BREEDS

Open to all foreign breeds. For example Haflinger, Freisian, Lusitano, Andulusian and Rare Breeds.

Class 10: HUNTER / HUNTER TYPES

Open to horses and ponies

Class 11: HEAVY HORSE

This classes is open to all heavy horse breeds for example Suffolk, Shire, Percheron and Clydesdale.

Class 12: MINIATURE/SHETLAND TYPE

INHAND CHAMPIONSHIP

ALL 1ST AND 2ND PLACE WINNERS FROM CLASSES 1-12 ARE ELIGIBLE FOR ENTRY.

THE WINNER FROM THE INHAND CHAMPIONSHIP WILL BE ELIGIBLE FOR THE SUPREME CHAMPIONSHIP

RING 2 – RIDDEN CLASSES

Start 10am — Judge: Sue Palmer

Class 13: BEST TURN OUT AND CONDITION

This class will be judged on the turn out of the horse and the handler! The horse will also be judged on condition but not conformation.

Class 14: NOVICE

Walk, Trot and Canter NOT to have won more than THREE times as a Horse/Pony Combination.
NO lead Reins.

Class 15: LEAD REIN

Leading rein pony, to be led by an attendant and shown in a snaffle bridle. Lead rein to be attached to the noseband only.

Class 16: M&M SMALL AND LARGE BREEDS

To be shown in natural state. Large and small breeds (incl. Shetlands) to be shown together.
Will split class if sufficient numbers.

Class 17: COLOURED

Open to any Piebald, Skewbald or coloured horse or pony.

Class 18: SENIOR

15 years +

Class 19: COB/COB TYPE

Show/Hogged or Traditional

Class 20: THOROUGHBRED AND PART BREED

Class 21: FOREIGN BREEDS, PART BREEDS AND RARE BREEDS

Open to all foreign breeds. For example Haflinger, Freisian, Lusitano, Andalusian and Rare Breeds.

Class 22: HUNTER AND HUNTER TYPES

Open to horses and ponies - no Lead Reins.

Class 23: HEAVY HORSE

This classes is open to all heavy horse breeds for example Suffolk, Shire, Percheron and Clydesdale.

RIDDEN CHAMPIONSHIP

ALL 1ST AND 2ND PLACE WINNERS FROM CLASSES 13 – 23 ARE ELIGIBLE FOR ENTRY.

SUPREME CHAMPIONSHIP

WINNERS FROM THE INHAND RIDDEN CHAMPIONSHIPS ARE ELIGIBLE TO ENTER THIS CLASS.

RING 3 – FUN CLASSES

Not to start before 1.00pm – Judge TBC

Entries £3.00 per class (taken on the day only)

Class 24: PRETTIEST MARE

Class 25: MOST HANDSOME GELDING

CLASS 26: PRETTIEST EYES

Class 27: BEST MANE AND TAIL

Class 28: HORSE OR PONY THE JUDGE WOULD MOST LIKE TO TAKE HOME

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. Payment of entry fee constitutes acceptance of these conditions of entry.
2. Entries may be limited in each class and classes may also be split or amalgamated at the judge's discretion.
3. All ridden horses must be four years old and over.
4. Owners enter their horses at their own risk and it is a condition of entry that no liability attaches itself to World Horse Welfare or the show organisers and assistants in any way whatsoever.
5. Hard hats must be correctly secured to a minimum standard of BSEN0384 or PAS015 and worn at ALL times when mounted.
6. Instructions given by organisers, officials and stewards must be obeyed in order to promote the health and safety of everyone present.
7. The judge's decision is final.
8. The organisers reserve the right to substitute any judge without prior notice.
9. All dogs must be kept on a lead at all times.
10. Riders should be the correct height and weight for their horse or pony. The organisers reserve the right to refuse entries if the welfare of a horse or pony is at risk.
11. No cantering allowed except in show rings and designated warm up areas.
12. Any exhibitor bringing any animal onto the showground labouring under any disease or lameness will be asked to leave immediately.
13. Every effort has been made to avoid classes clashing, but this is sometimes unavoidable.
14. Please do not skip out lorries onto parking areas.
15. Objections must be made to the secretary in writing within 10 minutes of the class finishing, along with a deposit of £50, returnable only if the objection is sustained.
16. No lungeing allowed anywhere on the show field.
17. A fall of pony or rider in any class will result in disqualification. The rider must not remount in the ring.
18. It is the owner's due diligence to ensure that horses and ponies are not left unattended whilst tied to the side of trailers or lorries
19. Correctly secured current British standard skull caps/riding hats must be worn at all times when mounted (including Side Saddle classes). NB. A rider whose hat comes off will be disqualified. A rider whose chin strap comes undone whilst competing must, on penalty of disqualification, replace it or fasten it before continuing. The rider may stop without penalty to refasten the strap.
20. Handlers of ponies in In Hand classes aged 14 years and under must wear correctly secured current British Standard skull caps/riding hats.
21. The Olympias Anthony Evans SSADL Home Produced First Round Qualifiers only are open to both members and non-members of SSADL.
22. No Spurs, Galloping, Wearing of Face /Body Jewellery. Foals are NOT permitted SSADL Classes.
23. For In Hand Classes- Minimum age of handler =9 yrs old.
24. STALLIONS- Either for In Hand or Ridden classes, Competitors Must be 16 years of age or over. Grooms if required must be 16 years of age and over. Competitors cannot enter the ring once the command of trot has been given. THE SAME RIDER/HANDLER/PONY/HORSE COMBINATION MUST STAY THE SAME FROM FIRST /SECOND ROUND QUALIFIERS AND GRAND FINAL.
25. ALL COMPETITORS SHOULD ACQUAINT THEMSELVES WITH SSADL RULES BEFORE ENTERING SSADL Rule book can be found at www.seniorshowinganddressage.co.uk
26. 1ST TO 3RD IN EACH CLASS WILL RECEIVE A£10 VOUCHER KINDLY SPONSORED BY ANTHONY EVANS INSURANCE SSADL QUALIFICATION CARDS & KEEP SAKE PRIZE CARDS 1st to 6th will be handed out in the ring at the time of presentation
27. COMPETITORS ONLY NEED ONE QUALIFICATION CARD PER SECTION PER SEASON IN HAND AND/OR RIDDEN IF ALREADY QUALIFIED THIS CARD MUST BE HANDED DOWN THE LINE
28. NEXT STAGE OLYMPIA 2ND ROUND QUALIFIERS – You can only compete in the Olympia Anthony Evans SSADL Second Round Qualifiers, if you are a 2018 member and your animal is registered with SSAD Ltd and hold the 2018 membership/registration card. Once you have qualified at a First Round Qualifier and you have received an Acceptance card, only then may you compete in the Olympia Anthony Evans Second Round Qualifiers. The Second Round Champions will go on to compete at the Olympia Anthony Evans SSADL Home Produced Supreme Final at the London International Horse Show in December 2018. Once a competitor has qualified for the Olympia Grand Final they may continue to compete at any 2nd Round Qualifiers, but they will NOT be eligible to enter the Olympia Qualifying Championships. In this instance the second placed competitor will be eligible for this championship.
29. **Once a competitor has qualified for Olympia in the Ridden section they are NOT allowed to qualify in the In-Hand section and vice versa.**
